In The Classroom

During April, we will be studying and learning all about chicks and animal life cycles!

Our reading series will focus on comprehension. As we reinforce these skills, it would be helpful at home to discuss the main idea of stories and the skill of drawing conclusions.

Our writing skills are really progressing! We will be moving on to writing narratives/stories using a beginning, middle and ending sentence. Our Washington State Kindergarten standards state students should be able to use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to narrate a single event or several loosely linked events, tell about the events in the order in which they occurred, and provide a reaction to what happened. Please see the back for a copy of the writing rubric we use with the kids. How "Egg" citing!

In math, we will be learning all about subtraction! Please encourage your child to use their subtraction skills during snack time- "If I give you 6 goldfish, and you eat 3, how many do you have left?" Math is all around us. ☺
